This expansion allows us to offer extended care for the youngest members of our community, furthering our mission to nurture children at every stage of early development.

Each classroom is intentionally designed to reflect our belief that children are capable and competent. Child-level sinks encourage independence, while open, inviting spaces foster exploration and discovery. Outdoor learning areas connect directly to the classrooms and include sand and water features, a magical garden, and gross motor spaces—creating environments that inspire curiosity, movement, and joy.

Our Preschool Director, Brianne Naman, is currently pursuing a RIE® (Resources for Infant Educators®) certification, strengthening our commitment to respectful, relationship-based care for children and families.

LET’S TALK ABOUT IMMIGRATION SERIES



This Wednesday, January 28, WPC will launch a four-session series, “Let’s Talk About Immigration.” Sponsored by the Mission & Outreach and Adult Education Committees, this timely conversation invites us to engage thoughtfully with an issue that elicits strong, diverse convictions.

We will gather **in-person and on Zoom Wednesdays at 7:00pm on January 28, February 4, 11, and 25;** we will pause on February 18 to honor Ash Wednesday. Each meeting will include prayer, reflection, and discussion facilitated by Pastor Chris and Jake Putich. We’ll use the *Doing Justice* online curriculum from Fuller Seminary’s Brehm Preaching, a Lloyd John Ogilvie initiative. The program reviews key concepts and history around immigration and then presents four different Christian responses. As we grow to understand why some hold differing positions, we hope this series will be more honest and go deeper than many of us have experienced. We also hope we develop a renewed, clarified passion that reflects God's heart for justice and mercy around this complex topic.

Preparation includes readings, online videos, and reflection questions. **The cost is \$10 per person; scholarships are available.** Today is the last day to sign up on the Side Porch or online at [westwoodpres.org](http://westwoodpres.org).

## FAITH CONVERSATION MOVIE SCREENING: *WHICH WAY HOME* —*SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 8*



All are warmly invited to join Adult Education in Hoffman Hall after worship on **Sunday, February 8, at 11:20am** for a screening of the acclaimed documentary *Which Way Home*. The film follows unaccompanied children from Central America as they journey through Mexico toward the United States – often alone, exposed to grave danger, and sustained by fierce hope for safety, family, and a future with possibility.

Told in the children's own voices, the film bears witness to suffering, hope, and profound vulnerability, inviting us beyond headlines and abstractions into lived human reality. Widely praised for its compassion, restraint, and moral clarity, *Which Way Home* was nominated for an Academy Award and recognized for bringing rare visibility to the human cost of migration.
