ABOUT WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY



World Communion Sunday, celebrated each year on the first Sunday in October, invites Christians around the globe to gather at the Lord's Table in a spirit of unity. The tradition began in 1933 at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, where

Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr—pastor and former moderator of the General Assembly—first envisioned a day to highlight the worldwide nature of Christ's church. The Presbyterian Church (USA) adopted the practice in 1936, and in 1940 the National Council of Churches commended it to congregations of many traditions. Since then, it has grown across denominations and cultures, making it one of the most widely shared Christian observances of unity.

This year, we are expanding our view of World Communion to include all of creation. The bread and cup at Christ's Table come from the good gifts of creation—grain, vine, soil, water, and sun. To eat and drink together is to remember that the Lord's Table is inseparable from the earth's table. Building hope means living in communion with creation: receiving God's abundance with gratitude, sharing it in solidarity, and caring for the earth that sustains all life.

While we are not celebrating with the Longest Table this year, we know that Christ's table extends beyond to all Christian communities around the world. We remember that countless siblings in faith around the world are sharing the same meal. In this feast we celebrate not only our unity as the body of Christ, but also our deep bond with creation itself.



Trunk or Treat 2025—Saturday, October 18


