# ORDINATION AND INSTALLATION OF ELDERS AND DEACONS



Today we give thanks for those called as Elders and Deacons. Our denomination's Book of Order reminds us that pastors alone do not lead the church.

Ruling elders are called "to discern and measure the church's fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and

nurture its faith and life." Together with the pastors, they "exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships." The needed gifts include "wisdom and maturity of faith, demonstrated skills in leadership, and compassionate in spirit."

Deacons' ministry, according to Scripture, "is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, the lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures, or anyone in distress."
