Music Director

Music for the service will be selected in consultation with the pastor and the music director. Music may include prelude, postlude, choral music or solos and normally should be sacred or classical music appropriate for worship. The Music Director will help you select music and will assist in finding soloists or other instrumentalists if desired. The Music Director may also be available to provide piano accompaniment, music direction to soloists or other instrumentalists, or direct the choir.

Organist

The church Organist may play for services held at the church. If our church Organist is not available, the church will provide a substitute Organist.

Planning Coordinator

The Planning Coordinator will assist in the planning and organizing of your service. They will schedule the maintenance and custodial staff, coordinate the production and printing of your program, arrange room set-up, coordinate your sound and technology requests, and help you organize a reception if desired. The Planning Coordinator will also provide you with your Memorial Fee Sheet and may be present on the day of your service to coordinate the staff and make sure everything is running smoothly.

THE FUNERAL OR MEMORIAL SERVICE

Our services celebrate life and give thanks to God for life eternal. The pastor/s will officiate at the worship service. Scripture is read, hymns sung, the Word proclaimed, prayers offered, and brief remembrances of the one who has died shared. The service ends by commending the one who has died to the care of God and sending the people forth with a blessing.

Service

Funerals and Memorial Services are held in the WPC Sanctuary. Services are typically between one hour and one and a half hours. The family may arrive up to an hour early to set up, drop off flowers, food, or other supplies, and run through the details of the service with a pastor. If you would like to arrive earlier, please consult with the Planning Coordinator. There may be an extra cost to pay our support staff to arrive earlier.

Bulletins (Programs)

Bulletins are prepared by church staff and include the Order of Worship. Please consult with the pastor about the Order of Worship, Scripture suggestions, and Words of Remembrance, Homily, or other aspects of the service. Please consult with the Planning Coordinator regarding picture(s), biography, and the number of bulletins to print.

Flowers

Flowers may be placed at the chancel (the front of the church Sanctuary). Additional flowers from friends and family may be placed at the chancel and at the reception if one is held in the church. Families are encouraged to take the flowers with them after the service. If they are not taken, our deacons will deliver them to our homebound and nursing home members. The florist we recommend is Westwood Flower Garden. They are familiar with our facility and have access to deliver flowers after hours or early morning prior to the service. Contact our Planning Coordinator for their contact information. The family may wish to suggest donations to a memorial fund in lieu of flowers. (See below.)

Memorial Designations

Memorial gifts may be designated as the family desires. They will be noted in the church's weekly News & Concerns if space permits. Donations to Westwood Presbyterian Church may be designated for a variety of specific ministries and missions. Your pastor can assist you in your decisions regarding memorial donations.

Portraits and Photography

Portraits and photographs may be displayed in the reception area, the narthex (entry area), and/or the front of the sanctuary. Family or friends are welcome to arrange these before the service. The church has easels that may be used for display.

Guest Book

A Guest Book may be provided by the funeral home with which you are working; or WPC is also able to provide you with one free of charge. Please be sure to have a family member or friend gather up the signed pages before leaving. The guest books will be available for signing at the entrances to the sanctuary. It is recommended to take them to the reception area as well.

Funerals and Cremation

If there has been a cremation, the urn or box of cremains may be placed on a table in front of the communion table. If there is a casket, a pall is to be used. The casket must be closed while in the sanctuary and covered with the pall. Pallbearers need to be selected by the family. Seats will be reserved for them in the front of the sanctuary.

Ushers

Ushering (greeting guests and handing out bulletins) is provided by our Usher Team. If the family would like to designate additional ushers to escort guests to their pews, the Usher team will assist them.

Sound, Video, and Livestream Services

Services include one designated sound technician. Video Recording and Livestream Services are also available at an additional cost. Please see the Memorial Fee Sheet for details.

Other Technology

The church provides the use of a large Smartboard to display a photo slideshow during the reception. The family is responsible for creating the slideshow and providing it to the church office prior to the service. You may email a link to the Planning Coordinator at least 3 days before your service, or provide a USB drive to the AV tech at least an hour before the service. Our AV tech will set up the slideshow to play during your reception. Photo Slideshows are available only during the reception in Hoffman Hall.

Parking

The WPC parking lot has approximately 80 spaces (including some double parking spots). If your Memorial Service is on a Saturday, the entire lot may be used for guests. If your Memorial Service is on a weekday, you may need to share the lot with Church and Preschool staff members. Staff and parking renters take up approximately 25 spots.

If you expect more than the available number of spaces, you will need to arrange for WPC to obtain a parking permit for street parking or purchase parking spots at the AVCO building next door. WPC can assist you in purchasing spots from the AVCO building or obtaining parking permits; contact the Planning Coordinator for information on costs.

Publication

Publication of the obituary is the responsibility of the family. The church office staff may inform callers about the date and time of the Memorial service as requested in the days leading to the service. If the deceased is a member of the church, we can notify the congregation about the upcoming service. We will pray for the family during Sunday worship. If the family would like, information about the service may be added to our Social Media and our confidential Prayer Chain. Please contact the Planning Coordinator if you would like your loved ones' service publicized to the church.

Reception

Receptions are held in Hoffman Hall (WPC's Fellowship Hall). The cost includes use of the church kitchen for 2 hours, paper products, tablecloths, and 1-2 custodians to prepare tables, set up food, and clean up. Use of church tablecloths, silverware, glassware, and china are not included in the Reception price, but may be added for an additional fee. Please contact the Planning Coordinator for details.

The Fee for Receptions does not include food. WPC does not have an in-house caterer, but the family may order food to be delivered to the church prior to the service. The church can also recommend affordable restaurants and caterers. Please contact the Planning Coordinator to arrange the reception and for details regarding fees.

MEMORIAL SERVICE PLANNING

Because it can be difficult in stressful times to plan wisely, members are encouraged to discuss and plan in advance necessary arrangements, including decisions about burial, cremation or donation for medical purposes.

Westwood Presbyterian Church provides this Service Planning Document as an offering that will help your loved ones devotedly carry out your choices at the time of your death.

A copy of this form will be kept in the church office and utilized by the pastors as they, with your loved ones, plan the specifics of your memorial service.
